**II. Playground Equipment**

Bids for moving the playground equipment, which was offered to the city park department from RBES, was discussed. The equipment, new, is estimated to have cost about \$100,000. The park doesn't seem to have any plans on where it could be put. The city did receive a bid from Nevois in the amount of \$32,000 for moving the equipment, reinstalling and includes \$11,000 in materials for a new ADA rubberized border, a handicap ramp and ADA mulch. Nevois was also willing to give a time and material bid, not to exceed his \$32,000 bid. Poetker is going to contact someone that Mike Moll recommended, to see if he is interested in giving a bid to move the equipment.

**III. Public Comments/Anything for the Good of the City (Discussion Only)**

Mueller stated that some attempt to work out of the north bay at Red Bud Tire & Battery has been made, but they are still working in the streets. The second bay is a total disaster. Chief Brittingham has sent a nice letter and has personally contacted Rich to warn that, effective July 1, 2016, citations will be written for working in the street.

Mueller is continuing to work on a rough draft of the property maintenance issue.

Mueller said that the ITEP sidewalk project grant had been submitted last Friday to IDOT for \$410,000. The city's match would be \$90,000. Spring of 2018 would be the estimated start date.

The planning commission is having a special use hearing for the house at 320 South Main Street, to be used as a second hand store. This will be on the July council agenda.

The meeting was adjourned at 8:11 P.M.
