

TITLE X: BUSINESS REGULATIONS - CONTINUED**CHAPTER 105: FARMERS' MARKETS****105-1: DEFINITIONS.**

(A) **“FARMERS’ MARKET”** A common facility or area where the primary purpose is for farmers, artists, crafters, and other vendors to gather to sell a variety of fresh fruits, vegetables, food items, and other locally produced or sold products directly to consumers. Any food item that is sold by a food truck or food cart shall comply with the applicable parts of Chapter 106, as amended.

(B) **“OPERATOR”** A not-for-profit entity which runs, hosts, or is responsible for the overall operation of the Farmers’ Market.

105-2: APPROVAL REQUIRED.

(A) It shall be unlawful for anyone to operate a Farmers’ Market in the City without first obtaining the approval of a majority of the City Council each calendar year. If the location of a farmers’ market changes during the year after initial approval, then the new location must be approved by the City Council as well before operations may begin at the new location.

(B) Any operator of a Farmer’s Market shall send their request for approval to operate a Farmer’s Market along with the location and all rules, regulations, policies, requirements, waivers, and applications which will be used by the operator to the City Clerk.

(C) The City Council, in their sole discretion, shall approve or deny all requests to operate a Farmers’ Market.

105-3: OPERATION.

(A) The operation of a Farmers’ Market shall be in accordance with all laws, rules, and regulations, including those of the State of Illinois, City of Red Bud, Illinois Department of Public Health, the Randolph County Health Department, and any successors.

(B) The operation of a Farmer’s Market shall generally be allowed in a Business, Industrial, Agricultural, or Mixed Use zoned district of the City. Special consideration shall be given to a request to operate in a Residential or Special zoned district of the City, in a City right of way, on City owned property, in a City park, or in any other area of the City. In any event, approval to operate a Farmer’s Market is in the sole discretion of the City Council.
